## **Get in the holiday spirit at Columbia State Historic Park!**

Getting into the holiday spirit, Columbia State Historic Park is decorated for the Christmas season and will host a variety of events throughout the month of December.

Starting the season off, the Columbia City Hotel Restaurant will host the **30th Annual Victorian Feast**. The feast will run from December 7<sup>th</sup>-8<sup>th</sup> and 14<sup>th</sup>-16<sup>th</sup> beginning at 6 pm each evening, and will include a melodrama featuring Mark Twain, Christmas carols, a five course meal and fine wines. Everyone is encouraged to come in historic costume or formal attire. Make your reservations now. Also, be sure to check out their New Year's Eve event. The weekends of December 8<sup>th</sup> & 9<sup>th</sup> and 15<sup>th</sup> & 16<sup>th</sup> the Columbia docents will be out in costume for **A Miner's Christmas**. Sit around a campfire drinking hot cider or coffee and join in conversations with miners as they roast chestnuts. Children can make some favorite crafts of the 1850s and keep an eye out for Father Christmas as he wanders the streets looking for good boys and girls!

The Columbia Chamber of Commerce will present its sixth annual **Merry Merchants** celebration. Merchants will be open until 8 p.m. Friday, Dec. 14, for stress-free shopping and the serving of traditional food and drink such as roasted chestnuts, gingerbread and hot chocolate. Father Christmas will greet visitors at the Tibbits House with freshly-made gingerbread. Local children and others will be singing Christmas carols, and visitors can take a free carriage ride on Main Street, then stroll over to Columbia House Restaurant to see the gingerbread houses on display. Anyone who would like to enter the free gingerbread house contest should deliver it to the Columbia House by 5 p.m. Dec. 14.
