"Celebrate on the Mountain" - Mount Diablo State Park, April 26th & 27th
Commemorate the 150th Anniversary of California State Parks and
Celebrate the 40th Anniversary of Mount Diablo Interpretive Association

A two-day event celebrating "all things Mount Diablo" is scheduled for April 26 and 27, from 10:00 a.m. to 4:00 p.m. at Mount Diablo State Park. The "Celebrate on the Mountain" weekend is dedicated to creating memorable experiences for participants.

Visitors will have the opportunity to explore the park at five distinctive park locations, and engage in various activities, such as conducted hikes, demonstrations and interpretive presentations. Over 50 informational and activity booths from local organizations and agencies will be featured.

"Celebrate on the Mountain" is a joint event of California State Parks and its valued cooperating association partner, the Mount Diablo Interpretive Association. The event commemorates significant milestone anniversaries of each entity: the 150th Anniversary of State Parks, and Mount Diablo Interpretive Association's 40th year of service to the park.

The event is free to the public; a \$10 park entrance fee per vehicle is required. Visitors should come prepared for being out-of-doors. Due to severe drought conditions, everyone is advised to bring drinking water as it is not available in most of the park. Packing a picnic is also recommended. Snacks and drinks are available for purchase at the park's Summit Visitor Center. For a schedule of activities see www.mdia.org.

Although it is a relatively low mountain at 3,849 feet in elevation, Mount Diablo dominates the surrounding foothills. An unobstructed view of the San Francisco Bay Area and the Central Valley can be enjoyed from its summit, and on clear days, the Sierra Nevada Mountains can be seen. Accessible by car, it is among the most spectacular vistas in California.
