McGrath State Beach Extends Camping Dates

McGrath State Beach will continue to remain open as we move into our summer season. The park will extend camping dates for the upcoming holiday weekend, with at least 40 sites being open and available on a first come-first served basis on Friday May 23, 2014 at 8:00 a.m.

Campers can stay through the holiday weekend with checkout being at 5:00 p.m. on Monday May 26th.

The 40 sites available will be “dry” campsites (no hookups available), and will be limited to a maximum of two vehicles per campsite. A tow vehicle and a trailer will be counted as two vehicles. The maximum occupancy of each site will be eight (8) people. Due to limited availability, each person can only purchase one site. Campers may be required to self-register into their campsite. The entrance gate will close at 10:00 p.m. daily. Refunds will not be given for these campsites. Campground fees for this weekend are \$45.00 per night for a campsite; extra vehicles are \$10.00 per night, per extra vehicle. Checks and cash payment will be accepted. Exact change is appreciated.

The park will be in an “under repair” condition, and the majority of the park will still be closed. Due to the hazards caused by the recent flooding, campers should expect to see dead and dying foliage in some areas of the park.

The restroom facilities, including hot water showers, will be open. The fresh water spigots in each campground loop will be available. The RV dump station will be open while the campground is open.

The park will be open for camping again on Friday May 31st through Sunday June 1st.

Beginning June 6, 2014, McGrath State Beach will be open for camping seven days per week. Day use parking will not be available due to flooding.
