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Portion of Coastal Trail at Half Moon Bay State Beach to be Closed to Public During Bridge Replacement Project

HALF MOON BAY, Calif. – California State Parks is replacing the Frenchman's Creek Bridge located on the Coastal Trail at <u>Half Moon Bay State Beach</u>. This project is expected to begin on Monday, May 14 and will take approximately three to four weeks to complete.

During construction, this section of the Coastal Trail is closed to public access. A detour will link pedestrian and bicycle access (see directions and map below). The remaining trail and surrounding area will remain open during construction.

The existing weathered bridge is approaching its life expectancy and is being replaced with a more corrosion resistant, aluminum bridge. Funding for this project is provided by California State Parks.

Detours:

North of Frenchman's Creek: Detour at Young Ave (Dunes Beach kiosk) onto the dirt trail. Follow the dirt trail south to Sweetwood group camp. Turn left (east) on the Sweetwood Trail. Turn right (south) on the Naomi Partridge Bike Trail along Highway 1. Turn right (west) onto Venice Blvd. Turn left (south) on the Coastal Trail.

South of Frenchman's Creek: Detour at Venice Blvd. (Venice Beach Kiosk). Turn right (east) on Venice Blvd. Turn left (north) at the Naomi Partridge Bike Trail along Highway 1. Turn left (west) onto Sweetwood Trail. Turn right (north) onto dirt trail and pick up the Coastal Trail at the Dunes Beach Kiosk.
